Open Day for Socially Indigent Population at Human Rights House Tbilisi

On August 23, at 12:00 lawyers of the nongovernmental organizations Article 42 of the Constitution and Human Rights Center will hold Open Day for socially indigent citizens in the conference hall of Human Rights House Tbilisi.

Article 42 and Human Rights Center are involved in the project "*Provision of Free Legal Aid to Georgian Indigent Population*" implemented by the Human Rights House Tbilisi.

Besides the citizens holding the status of socially vulnerable person, other people can also apply for free legal consultations on the Open Day and they are: family members of prisoners, probationers, victims of violence and torture, people with disabilities, internally displaced people, retired people, lonely mothers and representatives of other vulnerable parts of society.

In the frame of the project, lawyers of Human Rights Center provide indigent citizens with legal aid on criminal cases and lawyers of the Article 42 – on civil and administrative cases.

The project duration is 12 months. Hot line is working in the frame of the project – for criminal cases call 2 14 80 94 and for civil and administrative cases - 2 18 04 71.







The project is implemented with the assistance of the Eurasia Partnership Foundation (EPF) program 'Civil Initiative for an Independent Judiciary.' The project is funded by the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) and East-West Management Institute (EWMI)
