

## Free Legal Aid for Socially Vulnerable Citizens

Human Rights House Tbilisi launched Legal Aid Center, which will provide socially vulnerable, impoverished people with free legal aid. The project is implemented by HRHT member organizations – Human Rights Center (HRIDC) and Article 42 of Constitution.

In the frame of the project, five lawyers will issue free legal consultations on criminal, civil and administrative cases for the vulnerable part of society: socially vulnerable people, IDPs, people with disabilities, retired people, prisoners and beneficiaries of other closed institutions. Ongoing cases will be appealed at every instances of the judiciary system.

In the frame of the project, several public days will be organized for beneficiaries. Citizens will receive information about their rights and responsibilities; will receive publications on different legal issues and human rights.

HRHT Legal Aid Center will hold press-conferences on the cases of particular public interest, urgency and significance of the case. The press-conferences will be highlighted by TV-companies, news agencies and online media sources.

In the frame of the same project, law education center will be launched for the students of law faculties. Students will additionally attend master-classes.
